- 1. STAY 50 Metres AWAY
- 2. PUT DOGS ON A LEAD AND WALK AWAY
- 3. NEVER TOUCH A SEAL
- 4. DO NOT ASSUME A SEAL PUP IS 'ABANDONED'
- 5. IF THE ANIMAL YOU SEE IS DEAD RING: 0800652033

If you see a marine mammal on the water

- 1. STAY 100 Metres AWAY
- 2. DO NOT CHASE, SWIM WITH IT or FEED
- 3. TRAVEL PAST SLOWLY
- 4. ONLY WATCH FOR 15mins maximum:
- 5. ENSURE THE MAMMAL DOES NOT BECOME CONFINED BETWEEN BOATS OR BOATS AND THE SHORE.
- 6. ENSURE NO MORE THAN 2 VESSELS ARE AROUND THE MAMMAL AT ANY TIME.
